Dear Neighbors,

Flowers are blooming and the earth is offering an abundance of hopeful imagery. Spring reminds me of Divine abundance and God's desire to see the families in our program thrive.

These reminders are helpful when we are faced with some of the systemic realities that create hurdles for our program. For example, there is less than a 3% vacancy in fair-market housing in Harrisonburg. Though our timeline for bringing new families into the program has had to shift in response to such obstacles, we continue to invite new families to the program. Our third family has just arrived and we'll be looking to identify the fourth family this spring. We need landlords and neighboring volunteer groups to make this happen. We invite you to consider if you may be someone to step into one of these roles, working directly with the families in our program.

I assure you, it is making a difference...

- ◇ One family in our program, including two children, has secured a safe new apartment thanks to a landlord partnership.
- ◇ One mom recently passed an important exam in working toward her career goals, and has received the encouragement and support of her neighboring volunteers along the way.
- ◇ One family, including two children, have entered the program to find safety, consistency, and a stable new living situation. They have expressed joy in response to being a part of a neighborhood of support.

When the neighborhood of support envelops the resiliency, resourcefulness and resolve of our program participants, we are expectant that God will multiply the efforts through Divine abundance.

And despite the obstacles, I remain grateful for the amazing network of local agencies working to address the needs of the dispossessed in our community. Jane Ellen and I are working to strengthen inter-agency connections to best serve our families as well as the Harrisonburg-Rockingham community.
